## Beef Show Boot Camp

Georgia 4-H and Georgia FFA are pleased to invite you to Beef Show Boot Camp. This one-day workshop will cover sessions to help youth and adults become more knowledgeable about managing and showing beef cattle.

**REGISTRATION:** Registration is through Show Portal along with the Georgia Junior Beef Futurity due by June 20<sup>th</sup>. Participants do not have to be registered for the GJBF to attend but all cattle that are brought must be entered into 2025 GJBF. Registration fees are \$25 per youth. Adults are free to attend but must be pre-registered through Show Portal.

**WHAT TO BRING:** Comfortable clothing may be worn for class sessions, but jeans and appropriate show footwear must be worn for the showmanship clinic session in the afternoon. We ask that you have a show halter and show stick for cattle used in the showmanship clinic.
